


RK Foundation: Strengthening Our Community



NATIONAL SPORTS CENTER FOR THE DISABLED'S 44TH ANNUAL SKI CUP

Held in Winter Park in February, the <u>Ski Cup</u> is the longest running professional ski race in the country and an important fundraiser for the <u>National Sports</u> <u>Center for the Disabled</u> (NSCD), which is based in Colorado. This is the second year that the <u>RK</u> <u>Foundation</u> has sponsored the event.

NSCD is one of the largest outdoor therapeutic recreation and adaptive sports agencies in the world. It began in 1970 providing ski lessons to children with amputations for the Children's Hospital of Denver. Each year, more than 3,000 children and adults with disabilities participate in their programs. With specially trained staff and volunteers, and its own adaptive equipment lab, the NSCD teaches a variety of year-round sports and activities to individuals with almost any physical, cognitive, emotional or behavioral diagnosis.
